

ALONG

to have a friendly relationship, to leave a place, to survive

*"It's impossible to **get along** with her."*

DOWN (TO)

to give serious attention, to descend, to depress, take cover

*"Let's **get down** to work."*

AHEAD

to be successful, to make progress

*"He wants to **get ahead** in his career."*

OUT

to become known, go out of a place, become free of

*"I don't want it to **get out** that I'm leaving."*

OVER

to overcome, recuperate, make clear to sb

*"How would you **get over** that problem?"*

ACROSS

to make sb understand, move from one side to another

*"Your meaning didn't really **get across**."*

GET

PART 1

AROUND

to visit lots of places, persuade

*"It's quite easy to **get around** London."*

AWAY

to escape from sb/sth, have a holiday

*"She'll **get away** from work as soon as she can."*

DOWN

to make sb feel sad

*"When my work **gets me down**, I want to resign."*

THROUGH

to be connected by phone, succeed, to use up a large amount of something

*"I tried to call her but couldn't **get through**."*
