

AT

to keep criticising, gain access to sth/sb, find out sth

"You're always getting at me."

OUT OF

to avoid, exit, stop having a particular habit

"The only way of getting out of housework is to be ill."

UP

to stand up, get out of bed, ascend

"I got up from the chair and opened the door."

IN

to enter a car/train, arrive at a place, manage to do, buy a supply of something

"I'm inviting you to get in the car."

INTO

to become interested in sth, arrive at a place, win an election, be admitted into a school

"I'm getting into politics nowadays."

ON

to have a good relationship, how sb is doing, be successful, manage

"She gets on with everyone."

BACK

to return to a place, obtain sth again after having lost it

"Please, give me a call when you get back."

BEHIND

to fall into arrears, support

"If you get behind in your car payments, the car may be repossessed."

OFF

to disembark, to tell somebody to stop touching or using, leave work with permission

"We will get off at the plane at about 8pm."

TOGETHER

to collect people or things in one place, meet to discuss an issue

"We usually get together once a week."
