

ON

to wear, give sb the phone, switch on, start cooking

*"She **put on** a new pair of nylon socks."*

DOWN

to write, land, make so look stupid, pay part of a cost

*"**Put down** your name to join the choir."*

OUT

to stop burning, cause inconvenience, be upset, make sb unconscious

*"It took two hours to **put out** the fire."*

UP WITH

to tolerate, endure, accept

*"I can't **put up with** it any longer."*

IN

to apply for sth, elect a leader, fix equipment, interrupt to say sth

*"I decided to **put in** for a transfer to another service"*

AWAY

to tidy, send to prison, to save for later use

*"**Put away** any valuable or breakable projects."*

OFF

to delay, cancel, make dislike

*"Never **put off** until tomorrow what you can do today."*

PUT

ACROSS

to explain sth clearly

*"He was trying to **put across** a serious point."*

BY

to save money, perform an action without attracting attention

*"Try to **put by** a little bit each week."*

THROUGH

to connect sb by phone, continue and complete sth, make sb experience sth

*"He asked to be **put through** to the HR Manager."*
