continue; happen, take place

"When the headmaster entered, the teacher **went on** explaining the new topic."

OFF

explose; stop working or functioning

"I was writing an email when the light **went off**."

FOR

choose; like or admire

"Mr Stevenson doesn't **go** much **for** modern architecture."
