

OUT

be obvious or conspicuous,
in contrast to one's
surroundings

*"Tourist guides often carry umbrellas
so that they **stand out** in a crowd."*

UP

bring something up and
set it into a standing
position

*"Laura **stood** the sofa **up** on
end to clean under it."*

ASIDE

step sideways to make a
space for someone else

*"**Stand aside**, please, so the doctor
can get through."*

IN FOR

replace, to act as a
double or substitute for

*"I asked my colleague to **stand in
for** me so I could take the day off,"*

BY

wait in expectation of some
event, to make ready

*"Please **stand by** for more
instructions."*

STAND

FOR

tolerate

*"We won't **stand for** that type of
behaviour."*

BACK

maintain a safe distance from a
hazard, think about a situation as
if you are not involved in it

*"You had better **stand back** and let me
operate the chainsaw."*

BY

support, to continue to
support despite things being
bad

*"They **stood by** us all along and it's
awesome to know that they're still by
our side."*
