

OFF

stop by switching off, leave a road in order to travel on another

"Turn off the machine and unplug it when you leave."

OUT

result, end up, present at an event, empty

*"Our first meeting **turned out** better than expected."*

AGAINST

set against or in opposition to something

*"She **turned** her umbrella **against** the wind."*

OVER

change position, start, do business, think about

"Turn over the box and look at the bottom."

AROUND

change position, to become successful

*"You can't just **turn around** and say that it was all my fault."*

TO

seek help, become

*"Iron **turns to** rust in the presence of air and water. ."*

UP

appear suddenly, increase, be found, attend

*"He **turned up** out of the blue."*

IN

submit something, face the centre, hand sb in to the police

*"He **turned in** his paperwork to the main office."*

DOWN

refuse, reduce, reposition direction

*"He **turned down** all our offers of help."*

BACK

return to a previous state of being, refuse passage

*"Once you take this decision, there's no **turning back**."*
